### Greenhouse Fizz cocktail Crow

#### Ingredients: Limes Fresh mint leaves Sugar syrup Crushed ice Elderflower gin Soda water Lime cordial

#### Equipment: Jug Knife Wooden spoon Glasses to serve

#### Method:

- ♦ Wash the limes and mint leaves.
- ♦ Chop some limes into wedges I used three limes cut into six wedges. Give each wedge a squeeze as you drop it into the
- Tear the mint leaves in half as you drop them into the jug − I used a good handful.
- Pour in enough sugar syrup to moisten the mint leaves, then stir and bash the limes, syrup and mint leaves together with the wooden spoon.
- ♦ Add the crushed ice I filled the jug a quarter full.
- → Add the gin I poured in enough to cover the ice.
- → Top up the jug with the soda water.
- Add a good dash of lime cordial to give a hint of green colour to the cocktail.
- ♦ Give one more stir with the wooden spoon.
- ♦ Pour and enjoy, and of course...drink responsibly.

# Greenhouse Bunting

By the Crochiating Crow

Equipment:
4mm hook
Scissors
Wool needle

Ingredients:
Stylecraft special dk in
Parchment
Spring green
Grass green
Kelly green
Green

Abbreviations:
ss - slip stitch
dc - double crochet
ch - chain
htr - half treble
tr - treble crochet

Pattern (in UK terms):

For the flags - make as many as you would like.

Choose a colour and either ch4 and join with a ss or use a magic circle.

Rd I: (chl, dc,) nine times into your starting ring. Chl and join to first dc with a ss. Fasten off. (9 stitches, 9 spaces)

Rd 2: Join next colour with a ss in a chl space. Ch2 (as first htr).

(chl, htr into next chl space) 8 times. Chl then join with ss to second chain of starting ch-2. Fasten off. (9 stitches, 9 spaces)

Rd 3: Join next colour with a ss in a chl space. Ch3 (as first tr).

(chl, tr, chl, tr all into next chl space) 8 times then chl, tr chl into your starting chl space and join with ss to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of starting ch-3. Fasten off. (18 stitches, 18 spaces)

Rd 4: Join next colour with a ss into a chl space. Ch3 (as first tr), then into the same space that you've started in make a tr, ch3, 2tr. This is the first corner of your flag. \*In next space work 2 htr, in next space (htr, dc), in next space 2dc, in next space (dc, htr), in next space 2htr.\*

This is the first side of your flag.

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Rd 4 continued.: Make a corner by (2tr, ch3, 2tr) in next space. Then repeat from \* to \*, make a corner and repeat from \* to \* again. Join to  $3^{rd}$  ch of starting ch-3 with ss. Fasten off. (14 stitches on each side of triangle, 3 ch-3 spaces)

Rd 5 (Final round of flag): You have been working in the spaces between stitches. For this round you work into the stitches themselves unless working a corner. Join final colour with a ss into a ch-3 space. Ch3 (as first tr), then into the same space that you've started in make a tr, ch3, 2tr. Make I tr into each of the next I4 stitches. In ch-3 space make 2tr then ch3 and ss into third ch from hook (to make a picot) then make another 2tr. Tr into each of the next I4 stitches. (2tr, ch3, 2tr) into ch-3 space and tr into each of the next I4 stitches. Join to 3rd ch of starting ch-3 with ss. Fasten off and sew in ends. (18 stitches on each side of triangle, 3 ch-3 spaces)

To join your flags choose one of the colours and ch2O. Then ss into the very first ch stitch to form a loop. This can be used for hanging your bunting. Now ch 4O and pick up your first flag. Make sure your picot corner is pointing downwards and do into the top right hand corner of the flag, then do into each of the 18 stitches to left hand corner, and do into the corner. The amount you chain next depends on how big you would like the gap between the flags. I ch1O then attach the next flag. When you have attached all your flags ch4O and mark the last stitch. Now ch2O and ss into the marked stitch to form a loop. Fasten off and sew in any loose ends. Tadaaa! Greenhouse bunting!!!

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#### Rounds 1 & 2



I. Choose a colour and either chain 4 and join with a slip stitch or use a magic circle. Then chain I, and make a double crochet into your starting circle.





2. Chain I and dc into the circle eight more times. Chain I and join with a slip stitch to your first dc. Fasten off. You should have nine stitches into your circle.



3. Join next colour with a ss in a chl space. Then chain 2 - this counts as your first half treble stitch.



4. Chain I then half treble into next chl space. Do this in each of the 7 remaining chl spaces. Join with ss to second chain of starting ch-2. Fasten off. You should have 9 stitches and 9 chl spaces. (Those loose ends can be tackled now or later!)

### By the Crochiating Crow

#### Round 3



5. Join next colour with a slip stitch in a chl space. Chain 3 - this will be your first treble.



6. Chain I, then into the next space: treble, chl, treble



7. Repeat step 6 seven more times.



8. Then chain I, and treble into your starting chl space. Chain I and join with ss to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of starting ch-3. Fasten off. You should have I8 stitches and I8 spaces.

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#### Round 4



9. Join next colour with a ss into a chl space. Ch3 (as first tr), then into the same space that you've started in make a treble, ch3, and two more trebles. This is the first corner of your flag.



10. In next space work 2 half trebles,



II. in next space (htr, dc), in next space (dc, htr), in next space 2htr. This is the first side of your flag. Make a corner by (2tr, ch3, 2tr) in next space.




12. Then repeat steps 10 and 11 twice, omitting the final corner. Join to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of starting ch-3 with ss. Fasten off. You should have 14 stitches on each side of triangle, with 3 ch-3 spaces.

### By the Crochiating Crow

#### Round 5



13. You have been working in the spaces between stitches. For this round you work into the stitches themselves unless working a corner. Join final colour with a ss into a ch-3 corner space. Ch3 (as first tr), then into the same space that you've started in make a tr, ch3, 2tr. Make I tr into each of the next I4 stitches. In ch-3 space make 2tr.



14. To make the picot chain 3 and slip stitch into third ch from hook, then make another 2tr. This is the picot corner.






15. Treble into each of the next 14 stitches. Then (2tr, ch3, 2tr) into ch-3 space and tr into each of the next 14 stitches. Join to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of starting ch-3 with slip stitch. Fasten off and sew in ends. Your flag should have three sides, each with 18 stitches and three ch-3 spaces forming the corners.

#### By the Crochiating Crow

The Joining



- 16. To join your flags choose one of the colours and ch20. Then ss into the very first ch stitch to form a loop. This can be used for hanging your bunting.
- 17. Now ch 40 and pick up your first flag. Make sure your picot corner is pointing downwards and dc into the top right hand corner of the flag, then do into each of the 18 stitches to left hand corner, and do into the corner.
- 18. The amount you chain next depends on how big you would like the gap between the flags. I ch IO then attach the next flag. When you have attached all your flags ch40 and mark the last stitch. Now ch2O and as into the marked stitch to form a loop. Fasten off and sew in any loose ends.
